

# Renoir art lecturer to give a fine impression

AN INTERNATIONAL art expert will explore one of the definitive images of the Impressionist art movement at the Australian Decorative & Fine Art Society Gold Coast on Saturday.

Well-known art history lecturer Nicole Mezey will discuss Renoir's most famous work, the *Bal du Moulin de la Galette*.


Ms Mezey is a well-known art history lecturer, working for UK museums, universities and National Trust.

Her talk will examine the

1876 painting, considered Renoir's most important work, putting it into context within its own social, political and technological era setting.

Ms Mezey will look at what the public of that time expected of artists and touch on Monet, Degas and Pissarro.

Fine arts chairman Sandi Fueleop described the talk as "exciting news for Gold Coast art lovers." The talk will be presented at the Gold Coast Arts Centre Cinema 1 on Saturday at 9.30am.
